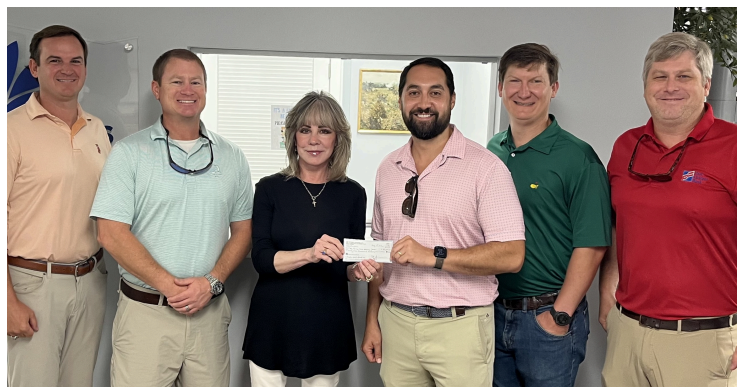

About Us

Kay Phillips Child Advocacy Center, formally Children in Crisis dba Dorchester Children's Advocacy Center and Berkeley Children's Advocacy Center, is a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit agency with locations in Dorchester and Berkeley Counties. As a nationally accredited Child Advocacy Center, our main goal is to ensure that children disclosing abuse are not further victimized by the intervention systems designed to protect them. That is why we offer child-focused, evidence-based programs, which work closely with representatives from many other disciplines in the investigation, prosecution, and treatment of child abuse. At Kay Phillips Child Advocacy Center, whether a child visits our center once for their initial forensic interview, or they visit us weekly for therapy services, one thing remains true - they will NEVER receive a bill for services provided. This means that cost never gets in the way of a child's path toward hope, healing, and empowerment.



A Letter from The Chief Executive Officer



Dear Friends,

As we reflect on 2025, we are filled with gratitude for a year defined by meaningful impact, strong community partnerships, and unwavering support for the children and families we serve.

Our strong community partnerships shone bright in April as we recognized National Child Abuse Prevention Month. This important initiative is dedicated to raising awareness and strengthening our shared commitment to protecting children, and we are so grateful

for the many partners who joined us by displaying pinwheels and distributing educational materials throughout the month.

In early April, the Summerville Exchange Club hosted their annual Azalea Classic Golf Tournament, followed by their brand new event, the Azalea After Dark Party. Proceeds from these events resulted in an extremely generous \$35,000 donation to our centers. Since 2006, their cumulative support has exceeded \$215,000, which is an extraordinary testament to their continued partnership and care for the children and families we serve.

Throughout the year, our community stepped up in a big way to support our Kids Care Hygiene and School Supply Closets. These programs allow us to further support our families by providing essentials, and ensuring that every child we serve is equipped for a school year filled with confidence and the tools they need to succeed. We are deeply thankful to everyone who contributed to these programs.

Our first of three annual fundraising events, the 21st Annual Troy Knight Memorial Golf Tournament, took place on May 5th at the Summerville Country Club. Along with our most anticipated event of the year, the 22nd Annual Pinwheel Gala on August 23rd, and our inaugural KPCAC Bass Fishing Classic on September 27th, we raised a combined total of \$255,975 in support of our evidence-based, trauma-focused mental health services! The fall season brought additional opportunities for education and collaboration. On October 29th, more than 125 Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) members from Berkeley and Dorchester Counties gathered at the Lowcountry Conference Center for our 9th Annual MDT Conference. The following morning we hosted our 4th Annual Faith Leader's Breakfast at Journey Church, equipping faith leaders from across the Tri-County with the tools they need to strengthen child protection efforts within their communities. More on these events can be found on page 15.

As the year drew to a close, we entered a busy and meaningful holiday season. Our Operation E.L.F. program celebrated its 20th year in 2025, bringing joy and holiday magic to more than 475 children, all thanks to the generosity of our community.

We ended 2025 with a strong year-end fundraising campaign. We are incredibly thankful to Dr. Robert Blackard for his continued generosity through a \$50,000 matching gift. We are equally grateful for the Bastion Group, who for the second year in a row, made a substantial donation to ensure we received the match; and to Landmark Construction, The Gobbler Gives, and all 166 donors who supported this initiative. Together, we raised a remarkable \$257,000 to sustain the vital services we provide at no cost to the children and families we serve!

Last but certainly not least, we would like to recognize our many grant partners, whose steadfast support makes a profound difference in the lives of the children and families we serve. From funding of our Safe Babies Court initiative in Berkeley and Dorchester Counties, which provides critical services for infants and toddlers in the child welfare system, to ensuring that our clinical operations remain available at no cost to every family who walks through our doors, their contributions help ensure that every child we serve has access to the care and resources they need to begin healing.

Throughout 2025, the compassion and commitment shown to us by our community made an immeasurable difference. We are deeply grateful for the support, not only during special events and campaigns, but in the everyday ways you help us advance our mission.

Together, we are creating a future where children can grow up safe, healthy, and strong.

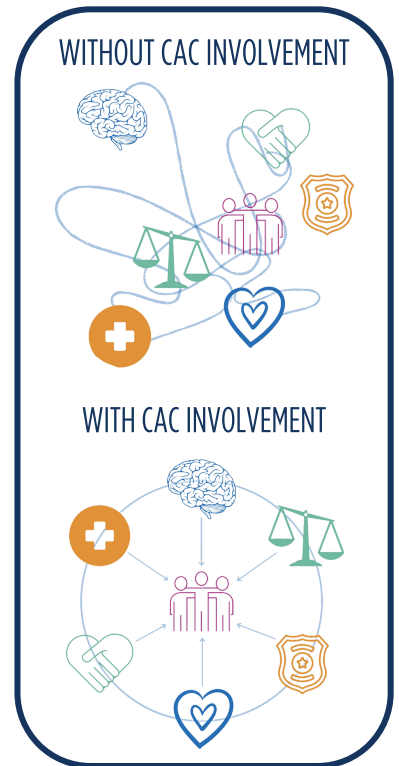
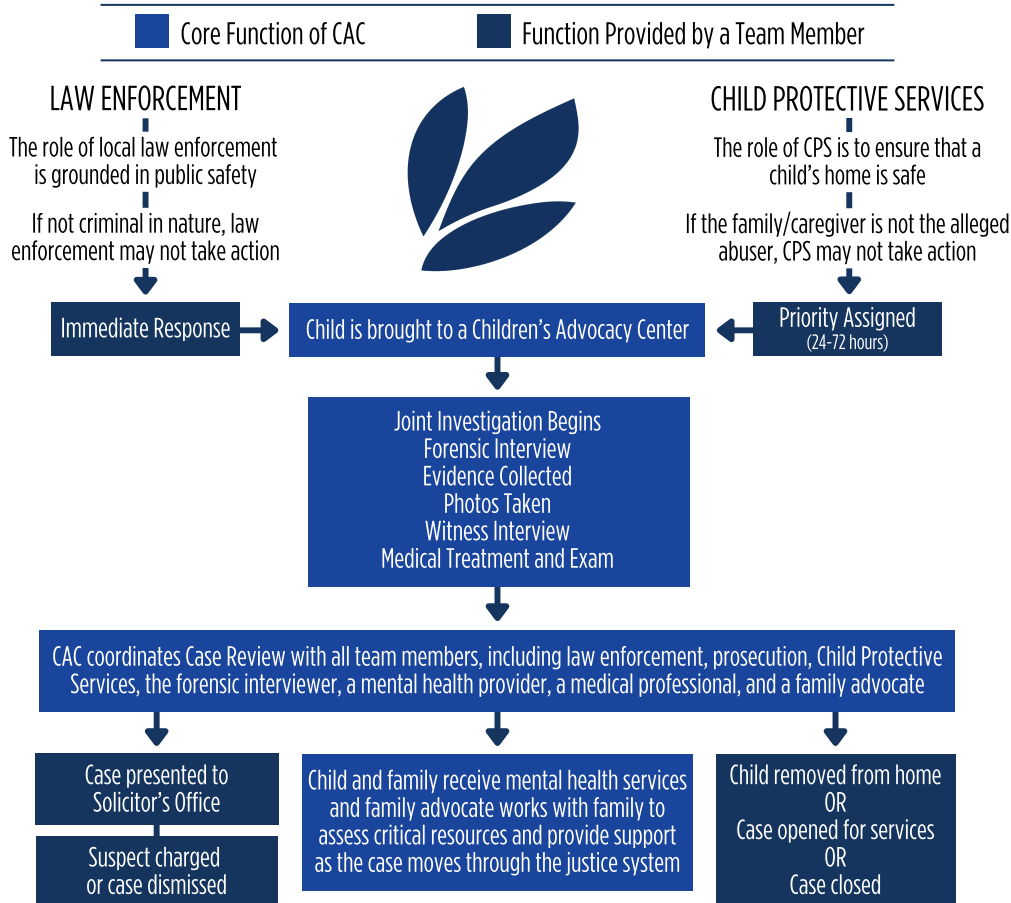

What is a Child Advocacy Center?

The primary goal of all Child Advocacy Centers (CACs) accredited by the National Children's Alliance is to ensure that children disclosing abuse are not further victimized by the intervention systems designed to protect them. The CAC model is about teamwork, and about putting the needs of the child victim first. Instead of taking a child from agency to agency throughout the law enforcement and child protective services systems, and subjecting them to multiple, repetitive interviews, the CAC brings the system to the child. In a CAC setting, agency professionals come together and work collaboratively to effectively investigate, prosecute, and treat child abuse.

HOW DOES THE CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER MODEL WORK?



A Positive Impact Story

A client came to our center after experiencing child sexual abuse with concerns for commercial sexual exploitation (CSEC) and began Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) with one of our qualified therapists.

When this client first began therapy, she rarely looked up. Shame and low self-esteem shaped how she saw herself and how she moved through the world.

But she kept showing up. Week after week, she put in the work. She challenged herself, even when it was hard.

Her family noticed the change first. They told her therapist they were beginning to see the daughter they remembered from before everything happened. She was more driven, hopeful, confident, and most importantly, she was happy again.

By the end of treatment, she could see the change in herself too. On the day she graduated from therapy, she shared that she once believed she would never finish high school. Now, she was going on college tours and planning for her future.

She hadn't become someone new. She had been given the tools she needed to cope with her trauma, allowing her to find her way back to who she had always been.

She also reflected on her forensic interview, describing how heard and comfortable she felt throughout the process. That experience mattered. Being listened to helped her begin telling her story and begin her journey toward hope, healing, and empowerment.

TF-CBT is an evidence-based treatment for children who have experienced abuse/neglect or any traumatic experience. 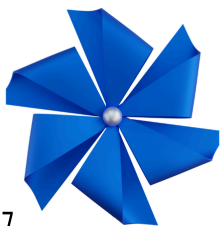
Child Abuse Prevention Month



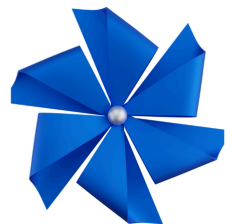
Each April we recognize National Child Abuse Prevention Month. Raising awareness is a critical first step in preventing child abuse and neglect, and we are so thankful to all of our partners who help us do just that.

In 2025 we provided pinwheels and educational materials to numerous community partners, including Dorchester and Berkeley County Sheriff's Offices, local Police Departments, DSS Offices, Solicitor's Offices, Libraries, YMCAs, Mayor's Offices, and local administration buildings. It serves as a visual reminder of the importance of creating safe, supportive environments for children, and raises awareness about the role each of us play in protecting children.

Multi Disciplinary Team Conference

Kay Phillips Child Advocacy Center (KPCAC) coordinates a Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) of professionals who come together and work collaboratively to effectively investigate, prosecute, and treat child abuse.

Each year, the center hosts a free conference on child abuse and neglect to provide specialized training for MDT members. On October 29th, more than 125 MDT professionals from Berkeley and Dorchester Counties attended the 9th Annual MDT Conference at the Lowcountry Conference Center in Summerville to hear informative presentations concerning the investigation and prosecution of child torture and corroborating evidence.

Speakers included Victor Vieth of Zero Abuse Project; Deana Lashley, MBS, D.O. and Erin Hart, DNP, FNP-BC from MUSC Child Abuse Pediatrics; and panelists, Chief Stephen Young of the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office, Susan Arms from the Berkeley County Department of Social Services, and KPCAC staff member, Millicent Fowler.



Faith Leader's Breakfast

On October 30th we welcomed Victor Vieth of Zero Abuse Project, back to speak at our 4th Annual Faith Leader's Breakfast. Faith leaders from around the Tri-County came to hear Victor's presentation, "From Sticks to Flowers: Guidelines for Child Protection Professionals Working with Parents Using Scripture to Justify Corporal Punishment".
